

# LGV FLEET INSTRUCTOR - COURSE CONTENT AND OVERVIEW

This course is designed for candidates wishing to undertake the role of an in-house instructor. The course will provide the necessary knowledge and skills to deliver LGV driver inductions, carry out driving assessments, deliver Driver CPC periodic training and remedial driver training. ### BY THE END OF THE LGV FLEET INSTRUCTOR COURSE CANDIDATES WILL:

- Be able to plan, prepare, rehearse and deliver classroom training
- Be able to plan, prepare, rehearse and deliver remedial driver training
- Be able to conduct and provide written reports of driver assessments
- Be able to describe the role and responsibilities of an LGV fleet instructor.

Candidates must successfully complete an independent examination to register on the <u>RTITB Register of Professional Instructors</u>.
